The Athens Tax Forum, hosted by the American-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce and its Taxation Committee, is set to take place March 28, 2014 at the Athenaeum Intercontinental Hotel.

The 10th Athens Tax Forum, to be held during the Greek Presidency of the EU, will focus on the decisive role of taxation policies during the crucial turning point of the Greek Economy. As taxation becomes a pivotal issue in Greece, the EU and globally, delegates will have the opportunity to examine critical issues that will affect State revenues, corporate policies, and individual tax considerations.

The Forum will examine crucial subjects for entrepreneurship:

- International and European initiatives to fight tax evasion and tax avoidance
- Tools to fight abusive taxation practices
- Tax residence/taxation of global income in Greece (CFC, FATCA)
- Retroactive mandatory taxation of non-taxable reserves of previous fiscal periods
- Thin Capitalization
- Intercompany billing (transfer pricing) /advance agreements/arm's length—APAs
- Uniform dual tax on real estate
- Flat tax system and implications on relocation of income/economic growth/employment
- Effectiveness and reliability of the tax administration
- Digital convergence and taxation (e-invoicing case study)
- Taxation delinquency/functionality and effectiveness of administrative and legal penalties

The American-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce continuously monitors taxation developments to identify taxation and economic issues, being obstacles to entrepreneurship and to submit suggestions and proposals, contributing to the implementation of a new "positive" strategy toward sustainable economic growth and development.
